- Q1.1 I see on the City website that there has been some public consultation (residents, stakeholders, community) in 2021. Do you anticipate any level of community engagement as it relates to the Public Art component of the project? Can you share any details, if applicable?

 Design Development End: July 2023
 Construction Start (Phased): Summer 2023
 Working Drawings: February 2024
 Construction Completion: Spring 2025

Art Installation: Spring/Summer 2025

- Q1.3 In addition to the 2008 Public Art Policy, are there any other regulatory guidelines or processes from the City that may apply to this project, or would the City be looking at the Public Art Consultant to guide the process based on best practices, precedents, and experience?
