1. **Leader of Tomorrow Award:** The Leader of Tomorrow Award recognizes a youth (11 to 18 years) who have shown leadership in the City of Airdrie through his/her volunteer involvement.
2. **Ambassador Award:** This Award is conferred to an Airdrie Citizen (proprietor) or a business entity that has made an outstanding contribution in promoting the City of Airdrie as a place for community and opportunity through volunteerism and philanthropy.
3. **Soul of Airdrie Award:** This Award is conferred to an Airdrie citizen who has made an outstanding contribution as a volunteer in the fields of art and culture, athletics, social and community services, and/or governance. This individual demonstrates a passion for helping others become resilient contributing members of the community.
4. **Volunteer Advocate Award:** The Volunteer Advocate Award is conferred to a not-for-profit organization, a volunteer-comprised grassroots committee and/or a community group that has demonstrated community leadership by engaging citizens through volunteerism.

Nomination deadline is March 31, 2010. Previously nominated individuals may be nominated again. Any individual, organization, association or business in Airdrie may be nominated for these awards.
